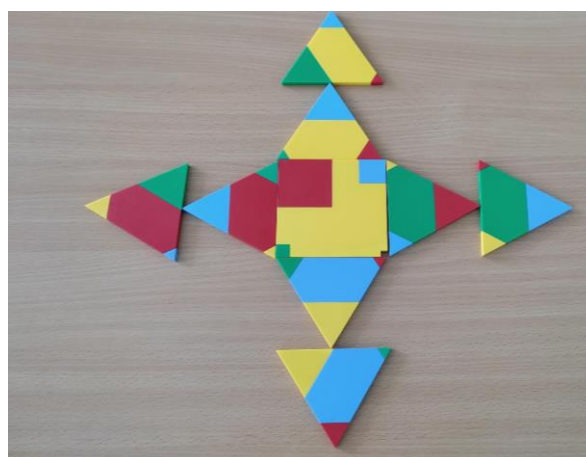
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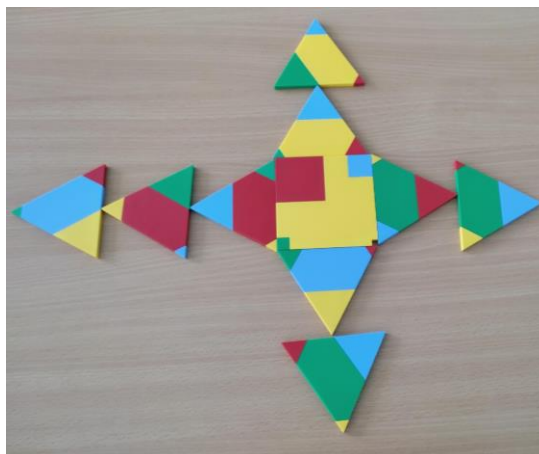
Description of the problem / exercise: **Triangle answer (quiz game)**

The game is played by four and everyone has one colour (yellow, red, blue, green), you choose randomly which colour is yours. It is random who will start the game first. Questions are read by the fifth person who is the judge, or it can be some playing card with questions and everyone is drawing it. Questions can be of any area (math, language, geography, history...). It is mostly for repetition of the material for the exam, but you can play it for fun.

For the game, you need one square, it doesn't matter which colour, and you need a set of triangles because you will play with it. First, you put the square in the centre, on the one side of that square, you can put the triangle with your colour and the others will do the same, but you need to have a correct answer to the question to be able to put your triangle on your side of the square if you miss the answer your enemies can answer on that question if he answers correct on the question he can put his triangle in your side of the square to stop you from your great run of answers.

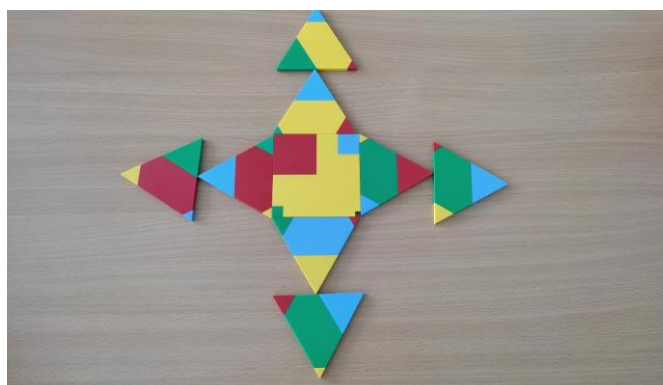
You can remove the enemy's triangle only if you answer the question of which he missed (the person who put his triangle on your side of the square) then you can renew your string. The game is played until someone has the most triangles. If there is a tie, they will play another round.





Example how to play the game:

We start the game, everyone has their triangles, the red one starts first, and the person reads to the red one a random question (Which is the capital city of Spain?) If he answered Madrid he can put his red triangle on his side of the square if he answered Barcelona and that's not the right answer by the judge then someone else can answer the question and put his triangle on the red one's side of the square and stop him from being in the lead. Then are answering the yellow, blue, and green one.
